### Exploring the Scottish Islands – with a collapsible bike! Colonsay (8 miles long, 1-3 miles wide - Pop: 135)



In our 'tour' of the Scottish islands, we're heading gradually westwards: next stop, Colonsay and Oronsay which, depending on the tide is either one, or two, islands! However, raised beaches on the west coast and beach debris in the interior mark a time when the sea was higher and there were actually 4 separate islands. Humans have been here for 7,000 years – and, in 1882, a Viking warrior who had been given a ship burial in 855 was uncovered in the sand dunes – together with his weapons, horse and coins. (On other islands, ancient buildings, even entire villages, have been revealed by shifting sands, often after a powerful storm...)

These islands have been in the family of Margaret Thatcher's one-time Minister of Defence, Lord Strathcona, since 1905. Colonsay House was built in 1722 and the sheltered Kiloran valley hosts palm trees, bamboo and many other exotics: and, with over 500 species, Colonsay has the greatest variety of flora in the Hebrides. It also hosts the extremely rare Chough (which looks like a blackbird with red legs and beak). To get to Colonsay, the ferry leaves from Oban - 40 miles to the NE – and it takes 2½ hours. Anyone you see on the ferry is going to Colonsay and no-where else! I was on the ferry in 2001 with a party I had befriended on a previous trip to a different island: there were a dozen of us and we were going to spend a week on Colonsay. We spotted a large silver Mercedes estate on the ferry and its rather glamorous owners: the ladies in our group were very taken with the man, who looked younger

than his 40 years. It later transpired that this was Alex Howard, 5<sup>th</sup> Baron Strathcona, and his wife!

Colonsay has undemanding contours, so one activity is to hire bicycles to go exploring: one immense surprise is to discover the Colonsay Bookshop, which looks far out to sea! One day, our old range expired and we had to ring the emergency number we were given: about 20 minutes later, a large silver Mercedes estate car pulled up. Our ladies excitedly shouted: "It's him, it's HIM!" We answered the door to our Laird ("Just call me Alex...") and, as he made his way to the kitchen, I heard one of our ladies in the front room mutter to another, "He's too sexy for his shirt!" There then followed a raucous, dirty cackle that the Laird must surely have heard himself! He was obviously a hands-on Laird and, as he crouched to inspect the southern reaches of the range, the northern reaches of his aristocratic posterior started to glimpse the daylight over his low-cut jeans - like dawn sunshine glancing the Paps of Jura. I caught sight of one of our female members fanning herself with her hand, in a mock attempt at swoon-evasion. The kitchen was now filled with people, as Alex dismantled the range: the men were interested to learn about the mechanics of it all and the women, also, seemed equally enthusiastic - but they developed a knack of learning about the engineering side without actually looking at the cooker. The men clearly put out by the attention that 'Alex' was getting – had. I think, their own opinions about where the sun shone from this particular Laird! Happy memories!

Our God is overwhelmingly generous towards us in his provision of all we have. We know from our scriptures, that whenever God provides it is never second rate, and you never see God holding back the best for himself. He simply keeps giving in abundance to us, all that we need and more.

It can be tempting because of the influences of the world, to behave like consumers of a product when we go to church, rather than as servants of God. Instead of giving regularly, we may be inclined instead, to pay a little for each service we actually experience, forgetting that in our absence money is still required. Our churches are our powerhouses of mission to build God's Kingdom. To keep

Our churches are our powerhouses of mission to build God's Kingdom. To keep them active, running, and growing we need ministry, and ministry costs money. It is no good us worrying about church improvements, if the ministry is disregarded. Without ministry our churches are just old buildings.

Our parish share primarily pays for our ministry. The small amount left over pays for things like training, and the administration that needs to happen in any organisation. It has very little to do with the affairs of the national church.

We know to our cost don't we, that especially in village life, such things as our pubs and village shops closing, because of lack of use and cash flow, is devastating. Similarly, the church is not immune to lack of use and cash flow.

It is heart breaking if we have to start thinking like that, and it is absolutely the last thing I want to even contemplate. However, if we want to keep our churches open for worship, available for the community for important things like weddings, baptisms, and funerals, we do already have the answer. We need to worship regularly, use the building and be realistic about our giving. This is a working together answer.

God keeps giving to us and wants us in full relationship with him, because that is the model for how we relate to others. Part of that process is about money, time, generosity and losing our fear of being as generous with God, as he is with us. In my experience when I have hesitated to give to God, but given anyway, I have never been left short. God just blesses us again and again when we are generous. I thank all those who already give generously, but I am appealing to us all, to prayerfully re-evaluate our giving. God keeps giving generously to us, so let us be generous in return.
